# No Yelling, No Chaos — Quick-Start Toolkit

## Why Yelling Doesn't Work

- Yelling creates distance, not respect.
- Students either shut down, push back, or tune you out.
- The real solution? Structure + consistency.

## 3 Practical Strategies

- 1. The Pause with Purpose
  - · Stop speaking, plant your feet, breathe slowly.
  - Pair silence with a clear next step already visible on the board.
  - · Students re-center because they know where to go next.

### **Try This Tomorrow:**

- Write your transition step on the board before class begins.
- When noise rises, pause and point silently.
- · Resume only when attention is back on you.

## 2. Positive Scripts + Tight Transitions

- Replace "Stop talking!" with calm, respectful scripts:
  - "I need everyone's attention so we can move forward."
  - "When you're ready, we'll continue."
- Plan transitions like part of your lesson—no downtime.

### **Try This Tomorrow:**

- Have materials pre-loaded and ready.
- Script your transition in 2–3 clear sentences.
- Use a timer or short sound cue to signal movement.

#### 3. Routines + Structured Lessons

- Routines reduce uncertainty and idle time.
- A well-structured lesson = fewer opportunities for disruption.
- · Key elements:
  - Entry routine (bell-ringer / Do Now).
  - Chunked activities (10-15 min max).
  - Active engagement (roles, discussions, quick checks).
  - Predictable close (exit ticket, reflection).

#### **Try This Tomorrow:**

- Add a Do Now to tomorrow's lesson plan.
- · Break your lesson into 3 chunks instead of one long block.
- End class with a 1-minute reflection or exit ticket.
